CITY OF MONONGAHELA, COUNTY OF WASHINGTON, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 21, PART 3 OF THE MONONGAHELA CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING EXCAVATIONS IN STREETS

WHEREAS, the City of Monongahela is a body corporate and politic, and a duly recognized City of the Third Class of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Monongahela has heretofore adopted a Chapter 21, Part 3 of the Monongahela Code of Ordinances entitled "Excavations in Streets"; and

WHEREAS, said ordinance and regulations have not been updated since 1995; and

WHEREAS, the City Council accordingly finds it prudent to repeal and replace the same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the City Council of Monongahela, Washington County, Pennsylvania that Chapter 21, Part 3 of the Monongahela Code of Ordinances is repealed in its entirety and replaced as follows:

Section 1. Permit and Inspection Fee, Deposit, and/or Bond.

(a) Any person, firm, public utility/municipal authority, or corporation desiring to make an opening in any street or public alley in the City of Monongahela for any house connection for gas, water or sewer, or for any other purpose, shall first make application for a permit and pay to the City Clerk a sum as set from time to time by resolution of the City Council as a permit and inspection fee.

(b) In addition to the permit and inspection fee, each such person, firm, public utility/municipal authority, or corporation shall also submit a cash deposit as set from time to time by resolution of the City Council. In lieu of the cash deposit, a minimum continuing bond in the amount of \$1,000 will be acceptable for a street or alley opening for each longitudinal opening segments of thirty (30) feet.

(c) The deposit paid or, in lieu thereof, the bond filed will be returned to the person, firm, public utility/municipal authority, or corporation one year after the deposit is paid, provided that the street opening and the work thereon is first approved by the City Engineer.

(d) Following payment of those fees and deposits/bonds as provided herein, the City Clerk shall issue a road opening, excavation, and restoration permit to the person, firm, public
